

## COMMUNICABLE DISEASE PREVENTION AND CONTROL

Investigation and follow-up on all reportable communicable diseases and outbreaks

### AIDS/HIV Antibody Testing and Counseling: 243-0411

- Free.
- Anonymous or confidential.
- Rapid Testing available.
- Call or see website for clinic schedule.

### Sexually Transmitted Infection: 243-0411

- Confidential follow up, education and counseling.
- Assistance in accessing treatment and testing.

### TB Control: 246-4516

- TB skin testing for persons exposed or at high risk of exposure (FREE) or for school or employment (FEE).
- TB medication management.

### Immunizations: 246-4516

- Free childhood immunizations at walk-in clinics throughout the county.
- Certain adult immunizations are also available. Call for detailed information.
- Call or see website for clinic schedule.

### Immigrant and Refugee Clinic: 266-4821

- All ages - people who have arrived in the U.S. in the past 6 months to 2 years, depending on risk.
- Screening, immunizations, medical and dental referrals.

### Intake Nurse Service: 266-4821

- Reporting of food borne illnesses and other infectious diseases.
- Referrals for public health nursing services and community resources.
- Answer questions about common communicable diseases and area health resources.

## ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

### Water Quality: 266-4821

- Residential testing for municipal and private well water.
- Private well and septic inspections (242-6515).
- Beach monitoring.
- Ground water monitoring of landfills.
- Surface water (lakes and rivers) monitoring and protection.

### Outdoor Air Quality: 243-0330

- Answer questions or concerns regarding outdoor air quality problems.
- Evaluate air quality data.
- Provide information about reducing air pollution.

### Animal Services: 267-1989

- Rabies prevention, animal bite follow-up.
- Cruelty/neglect investigations.
- Rescue trapped or injured wildlife.
- Education and enforcement of animal related issues.
- Stray animal pick-up.

### Food Protection: 243-0330

- Food establishment licensing, inspection, regulation and enforcement.
- Education of food establishment employees and general public.
- Investigation of foodborne and other food establishment complaints.
- School food service inspection and education.
- Food product testing (266-4821).

### Other Licensed Establishments: 243-0330

- Hotel, motel and other lodging establishment licensing and inspection.
- Public swimming pool and whirlpool inspection and testing.
- Tattoo and body piercing licensing and inspection.
- Recreational educational camps, mobile home parks and campground licensing and inspection.

### Environmental Health Hazards: 243-0330

- Investigate environmental complaints, including lead, mold, and indoor air quality.
- Investigate spills of hazardous materials.
- Radon consultation and testing.
- Assist in addressing household hygiene problems.

### Hazardous Waste Disposal (Clean Sweep): 243-0368

- Collect hazardous materials from households, small businesses, and farmers.
- Reusable household chemical products available.

### Lead Screening and Home Evaluation: 266-4821

- Lead screening for children 9 months to 6 years who are unable to be screened by private medical provider.
- Evaluation of homes for families with children who have elevated blood lead levels.
- Information and consultation for lead-safe renovation, remodeling and clean up.
- Testing of paint and water for lead content.

### West Nile Virus, Mosquito Monitoring and Control: 266-4821

- Monitor public water sources for mosquitoes.
- Limited control of waters that are breeding zones for mosquitoes likely to cause West Nile Virus.
- Provide information about preventing mosquito breeding on private property.

### Tobacco Control and Prevention: 266-4821

- Coordinate Tobacco Free Dane County Coalition which promotes smoke-free indoor air policies, youth prevention education and provides cessation resources.
- Tobacco vendor compliance programs.
- First Breath cessation program for eligible pregnant women.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

### 266-4821

- Develops, trains for and exercises responses to potential emergencies such as pandemic influenza, natural disasters and bioterrorism.

## HEALTH PROMOTION

### WIC: Women, Infants and Children Nutrition Program: 267-1111

- Provides nutrition and breastfeeding education and vouchers for nutritious food for eligible pregnant, breastfeeding and postpartum women and children up to age 5.
- Must meet income eligibility guidelines.

### Perinatal Services: 266-4821

- Support and services for pregnant women.
- Nurses and Families Together weekly bilingual parent education and support class

### Breastfeeding Education and Support: 243-0449

- Free classes for pregnant women.
- Individual consultation before and after your baby is born.

### Wisconsin Well-Woman Program: 242-6392

- Free breast and cervical cancer screenings for income eligible women ages 35-64 who have little or no insurance.
- 25 clinics to choose from.

### Oral Health: 266-4821

- Dental health program for children 4-18 years of age, who do not have Medical Assistance or dental insurance. Must meet income guidelines.
- Free fluoride supplements for children whose families have a private well or who live in the Village of Dane.
- Sealants for families without dental insurance.

### Chronic Disease and Injury Prevention: 266-4821

- Monitor disease and injury rates and trends.
- Raise awareness and work in collaboration with other community organizations to implement community based prevention strategies.

### Neighborhood Community Health: 266-4821

- Collaborate with the community to assess, develop and implement strategies that target health and safety concerns and the social needs of communities.
- Partner with providers and residents by participating on planning teams and coalitions to develop programs responsive to community health needs.
